Why it works: Creates solidarity among small HOAs and condos, emphasizing fairness and economic justice.

5. It's a Solution in Search of a Problem

Message: Where's the crisis? HB 303 regulates our communities without any proof it's needed. Why it works: Makes people question the very premise of the bill, reducing urgency for its passage.
